Community Education at Highfield

Community Education is planned to provide pupils with real-life practical experiences to support them in their development in becoming active members of their communities and wider society.

From Years 7 to 9 students will engage in a double lesson each week.

From Years 10 and 11 students will engage in a triple lesson each week with an Hour of Outdoor Learning

We appreciate that our pupils come from a diverse background and have a range of experiences. We are therefore developing a spiral curriculum for pupils to access this means that no matter their age or stage staff will have differentiated activities that will benefit and stretch all pupils. Pupils are continually assessed by the staff during the term as previous experiences can mean that pupils have different areas of strength week to week.

Many pupils do not yet go out by themselves. At school they have a higher level of responsibility for themselves and we see their confidence grow as we take them out into the community as part of the curriculum and explicitly develop their skills and highlight. Pupils act very differently from school to home.

Pupils across School will continually discuss who Safer Strangers are.

The Community Education sessions will be made up of different components:

<u>Citizenship</u>

By the end of Year 11 students will have learnt about their place in different types of community: School, where they live, Wakefield (or other LA), Country and their place in the wider world.

They will have a practical understanding of what they contribute to groups on different levels.

Students will also have opportunity to gain an understanding of their rights and duties as a citizen in the United Kingdom.

The planned curriculum will be mapped against the Government guidelines for mainstream and adapted to meet the needs of Highfield pupils.

Accessing the Community:

By the end of Year 11 students will have had regular access to the local community and had real-life opportunities to access services and understand how they may use them in the future.

Students will have spent time considering how they stay safe around others when in the community.

Road & Travel Safety

Students will have regular opportunities to build up their independence in keeping themselves safe when out in the local area. They will develop responsibility for themselves.

As they progress into Key Stage 4 this will develop further with the use of public transport.

The pupils will be assessed against the relevant section of the 'Preparation for Adulthood: Independent Living Tracker'.
